




Planning a trip to Big Desert national park.

Alan Kendall





Trip Report - Anglesea/Otways March 2023

Trip Leader: Chris Butterworth.

We planned an exploration of the tracks around Anglesea and Paddy's Swamp. The weather was fine and the company outstanding.

We set off from IGA, heading into Anglesea heath around Alcoa Boundary Track.

The going was easy around, though this was likely because when we tried to access a number of the tracks that looked like they had a more difficult rating we found them closed. In fact many of the tracks we had planned to do were closed, making it difficult to take the planned route.

On the whole though, the tracks around Anglesea made for a pleasant trip and would be well suited to beginners whilst the weather is dry. On a wet day conditions would likely deteriorate quickly.





In search of adventure we found ourselves on Powerline track. Whilst the top of the hill is gated, there is a bit to explore on the track leading up the hill. We found a deep rutted section with a bit of a drop and a few of us tested it out.

While a couple made it down, whilst playing about a patrol, prado and finally the 80 series got stuck by slipping into the ruts and diffing out. This resulted in a lengthy recovery.





Once we had ourselves together again we made our way along Denham track, which was an easy but enjoyable run through the forest.

We reached the Paddy's Swamp area late in the day and checked out an unnamed track near Hammonds Road Campground. This turned out to be a very difficult, steep decent into a creek with no easy exit. As it was 4.10pm we decided this was a bad time to start on such a challenge and made our way towards the pub.















On the way we checked out Gentle Annie Track which was easy, Clarke Spur track, which was closed, and Cole Mine Creek track, which was easy enough, but fun all the same. We exited out onto the great ocean road with spectacular views.


In all, it was a good day to get out in the fresh air and enjoy the scenery. Anglesea heath though is not worth the visit for anything other than a casual and easy exporation.

We aired down once we hit dirt road, did a few shakedown tracks before making our way up to Mt. Terrible. We had a bit of everything, ruts, rocks, some bog holes but not the Lerderderg kind. It was a good test for the vehicles, albeit nothing too technical. It was just right for our group.




Stopped for quick lunch, looked around the hut and then made our way to Eildon. Few steep sections going down from Mt Terrible and we took it slow and easy. I had my tyred down to 18psi and Phil had his at 16Psi. Brad was in the low 20's. All good, no damage, no skidding, all smiley faces.





We reached our 4 O'clock track called Steep track which leads to our final destination - Foggs Lookout, it overlooks Lake Eildon. It was a great track to finish our day and it looked like the boys had a great time. This was the track that got me started in 4WD. My mate, Conrad De Souza brought me on a trip and this was where it all began for me. A month later I bought my mighty V6 Prado. I shared this story with the boys and they nodded, smiled and said, I can see why – it's a great track. Total time was about 11+ hours and just under 500Km driven. It was a big drive, with a group of guys who love driving.









How to run a Club Trip

It's easy to run your own trip, here are the steps to running a great club trip.

- Contact the Trip Co-Ordinator tripcoordinator@werribee4wdclub.com.au
- The Trip Co-Ordinator will forward on required Trip register etc via email Print out prior to the trip
- Create an Event on Facebook
 - a. Go to Facebook Member's page
 - **b.** Click Events,
 - **c.** Click + in top right-hand side,
 - d. In person Then add date & times,
 - **e.** Location could be the meeting place, Add description, This should be amount of spots available, Required recovery gear, Required training level or Easy, Medium, hard. Meeting place and time to meet. (Remember to make your meeting time 20 30 minutes earlier than departure time to allow filling out Trip Register and group chat about the trip.
 - **f.** Invite all members.
 - g. Click Create Event.
 - h. Member's will reply with name and car number e.g.: Trev & Wassana Car #1,
 - i. Next car will indicate Name & Name Car #2 and so on.
 - **j.** Once the trip is full members will reply Reserve Name & Name Car #1 the reserve car will then slot in if there is a cancellation.

Its recommended to limit the number of Cars to 10, if it becomes popular you can find another trip leader to run two groups.

On the Day

Items for the pre-trip discussion.

- Introduction of Trip leader, Tail End Charlie, and general introduction of members on the day
- Allocate a member to run the trip report (usually whoever arrives late or first to get a "fine")
- Convoy Procedures.
- It's generally worth putting experienced members between inexperienced members and introduce new members.
- On departure get each car to do a radio check (UHF channel 27), nothing worse than losing someone because they can't hear instructions or direction.

After the trip

- Follow up your trip with a fun post on the Members Facebook page.
- Create a photo album on the Members page for the event and encourage members from the trip to share pictures.
- Submit trip report to the Trip Co-Ordinator.








How do I get the Sat Phone?
