Little Desert - 22-24 April

Sunlight lapped across the desert floor. Our small group stirred and began the morning ritual. The smell of bacon filled the campsite, accompanied by the cackle of kookaburras and a light rustle of gum leaves.

Ackle Bend campground is a short drive from the small town of Dimboola. Bordered by the Wimmera River and Little Desert, it's as picturesque as it is convenient.

We set off down the dirt track out of the campsite, a group of 8 cars aired down and ready to go.

Turning down One Tree Hill Track we got our first taste of the day ahead. Soft sand.


Reaching the intersection with Eagle Swamp Track we came face to face with a sandy hill and steep tracks to the top.

First up was the Discovery and on fresh sand with a bit of right foot, it sailed up. Next the Patrol, up in one. Then the Ranger, coming within a couple of feet of the top it didn't quite carry the momentum on the first try but was up on the second run.



With the sand now chopped up, from this point forward at least 3 vehicles needed to be winched or dug out, giving us an early test of our recovery skills that fortunately weren't required for the rest of the trip.

Heading down Eagle Swamp track we came to a large salt flat and a chance for a quick photo op.





From here we headed north on Dry Well Track as the landscape changed to open planes blanketed with Mallee-Broombush and we caught the first fleeting glimpse of an Emu.

The track was easy and we were quickly on to Northern Break. Here were encountered a series of short sharp hills, soft sand and divets.

Nearing the intersection of Pump Jack track we passed a burn-off. The air was thick with smoke and in our haste to move on, and thanks to a patch of soft sand, our group became divided. A short while later, reunited and with fines issued, we continued on.

Turning down Pump Jack Track the terrain transformed. From dense brush on winding roads to a long desert track with bump after bump. The open plains with sparse trees and a light covering of brush reminiscent of a Safari.

We followed the track until we reached Albrecht's mill, an old bore hole with the rust coated remnants of a windmill.

From here we picked up the pace. Down Salt Lake Track, Dahlenburgs Milll Track, and Mallee Track. Each provided a soft sand experience but little challenge.

Turning onto McAbes Hut track we encountered a couple of wet sections which most of us skirted around, only the Patrol picking up a good splattering of mud. With a bit more rain, some of these sections would become quite challenging.

We made quick progress down to River Track on the lower boundary of the Park. Here the landscape changes to grassy woodland. Gum trees interspersed with bright green Oyster Bay Pine.


We progressed along the winding, bumpy track, shaking us out of a late afternoon haze. As we passed the treeline, the light filtered through the canopy to the dappled desert floor. Kangaroos hopped alongside, mimicking our own bouncing motion.

As the tracks ended we made our way back to camp along a tree-lined dirt road.

That evening we visited Dimboola Pub, where each of us was greeted as we walked in. We were led to a back room, filled with antiques and high back chairs that could have dated back 100 years, the charm of the decoration only matched by the staff and locals within.

After a parma and a walk around the Steam Punk festival, we headed back to camp to enjoy the warm glow of the fire, a sky full of stars, good company, and a horribly burnt damper.

The next day many headed off, whilst a select group remained to explore the area. A trip to Pink Lake had us harvesting our own pink salt and hunting millipedes. We found spectacular views among dramatic cliff faces at Mount Arapiles, and on heading back to camp decided to give that last stretch of track from the day before another go.



It's hard to capture a place in words. From the flora and fauna; to the undulating terrain and captivating people. The whole experience was replenishing for the soul.







- Create an Event on Facebook
 - a. Go to Facebook Member's page
 - **b.** Click Events,
 - c. Click + in top right-hand side,
 - **d.** In person Then add date & times,
 - **e.** Location could be the meeting place, Add description, This should be amount of spots available, Required recovery gear, Required training level or Easy, Medium, hard. Meeting place and time to meet. (Remember to make your meeting time 20 30 minutes earlier than departure time to allow filling out Trip Register and group chat about the trip.
 - **f.** Invite all members.
 - g. Click Create Event.
 - h. Member's will reply with name and car number e.g.: Trev & Wassana Car #1,
 - i. Next car will indicate Name & Name Car #2 and so on.
 - **j.** Once the trip is full members will reply Reserve Name & Name Car #1 the reserve car will then slot in if there is a cancellation.

Its recommended to limit the number of Cars to 10, if it becomes popular you can find another trip leader to run two groups.

On the Day

Items for the pre-trip discussion.

- Introduction of Trip leader, Tail End Charlie, and general introduction of members on the day
- Allocate a member to run the trip report (usually whoever arrives late or first to get a "fine")
- Convoy Procedures.
- It's generally worth putting experienced members between inexperienced members and introduce new members.
- On departure get each car to do a radio check (UHF channel 27), nothing worse than losing someone because they can't hear instructions or direction.

After the trip




