

Going down this hill wasn't so bad but at the end the winch came out when we had to do a sharp turn into a nice deep slippery bog hole. We spent quite a bit of time

winching and trying to drive this, but with zero traction the winch did all the work. After getting through this we had a nice slide down the hill, and I really mean slide as there was still no traction to be found.





We parked up at the bottom for some lunch, then walked a small section of track finding some good big holes which then came to a vertical drop, then straight up a vertical wall. We decided not to continue further as we both had work the next day and didn't have the time to complete this.


So we walked back and I had a bit of a play thru some of the bog-holes and ended up winching through all of them. We then went to get out the track, this was no easy feat. Just getting to the start of the climb was a challenge, and then out with the winch again. Pulling ourselves up this hill, we had to move inch by inch and find spots with just enough grip so we could stop and reposition the winch.

After a few hours we made it out. We met a few people along the way, one that helped us out with running winches and recovery gear all day. After airing up we headed into town for a seafood pie but sadly the place was closed, so stopped next door for some drinks and food then off home we headed along the great ocean road - always an amazing drive along there with great views.

We parted ways at the Werribee exit and went home.

I'm looking forward to getting back out there soon to complete this track when we have a couple of days to spare.

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

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
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Trip Report - Portland Sand Dunes


Werribee District 4WD Club



First weekend out of metropolitan Melbourne lockdown and we couldn't wait to get out. What better place to go than Portland for a bit of sand driving? While some people headed out on Friday night, we left before the crack of dawn on Saturday to join up with club members from both Werribee and Eureka 4WD Clubs. Swan lake camping ground is run by Portland Dune Buggy Club and is the only way to access the amazing sand dunes.

Once everyone arrived and set themselves up (How quick are some of these new campers/caravans to set up!), we all deflated our tyres and headed out to do some sand driving. I have never experienced this type of driving before and I have to say it took a bit of getting used to all the slipping and sliding as we drove. BUT how amazing was the scenery. I have never seen such a pristine environment, where the pale-yellow sand went on seemingly forever.





With Marcel leading the way we swerved and swayed over the dunes, with some fishtailing as we hit the soft sand. We even spotted some emus running ahead of us over the hills. About an hour into our drive, Michael decided to check some alternative routes through the dunes and he became our first recovery for the day.



Sinking pretty heavily into the sand, all hands on deck were required to dig out the tyres. With 4 max trax and a fair amount of winching from Marcel and Trevor, Michael's Ranger was recovered.



After a brief mechanical scare, it started up again and we took off for more exploring. We headed to the beach for the obligatory CAR LINEUP photo.



Some of us headed back to camp, with a quick snatch strap recovery required for the Prado, when we got stuck on a hill. The Eureka crew stayed out and when they came back we heard stories of another recovery needed, with another Ranger getting stuck on the side of a dune. Slipping fast it took some slick manoeuvring with the winch to get it back on track. Conveniently no photos of that recovery were taken.....lol





We all joined in to collect firewood, raiding some nearby dead eucalyptus trees for fuel. While waiting for dinner to cook, I took the opportunity to check out everybody's sleeping quarters. It was like my own Caravan and Camping show and certainly makes me want to upgrade from sleeping on the floor.

We finished the night around the camp fire, getting to know everyone, telling stories old and new. I don't think I've ever seen such a massive fire, fuelled by those 'dead' eucalyptus leaves. Pretty sure the flames nearly singed my eyebrows!

Morning came, along with the realisation that Michael's car had leaked all its transmission fuel overnight and was KAPUT. Sue and Michael's day was spent trying to find signal to call NRMA and organise a tow for the car and the caravan back to Point Cook.

While that was being done, and as we were not able to help the situation, a few went back out into the dunes. Marcel found himself in a bit off difficulty, using his max trax to dig himself out. We moved on finding a "bowl" amongst the sand dunes, where several attempts were made to get up one of the biggest, steepest dunes I've seen (which isn't many). Only the FJ Cruiser and the 79 Landcruiser being successful.







Back at camp a tow truck arrived for Michael and Sue. Taking the car on it 's tray and towing the caravan, it got stuck on a hill exiting the campgrounds. Once again, all hands-on deck to help out. Unhooking the van, Trevor took over towing it to the highway, while the tow truck took off with the car. Only to find that the tow truck went one way, while Trevor went the other. Eventually finding each other, Michael and Sue headed home to Point Cook, with their car and van.

Another fire, once Marcel's potatoes had cooked, more chatting about the days events and I was ready for bed.

Packing up early morning on Monday, everyone headed back home. Garry and I took the opportunity to take it slow and explore Cape Bridgewater. After a lovely breakfast, we saw the blowholes and the petrified forest. Then headed off back home.



Four Wheel Drive Lifeblood Challenge



How to run a Club Trip

It's easy to run your own trip, here are the steps to running a great club trip.

- Contact the Trip Co-Ordinator tripcoordinator@werribee4wdclub.com.au
- The Trip Co-Ordinator will forward on required Trip register etc via email Print out prior to the trip
- Create an Event on Facebook
 - a. Go to Facebook Member's page
 - **b.** Click Events,
 - c. Click + in top right-hand side,
 - d. In person Then add date & times,
 - **e.** Location could be the meeting place, Add description, This should be amount of spots available, Required recovery gear, Required training level or Easy, Medium, hard. Meeting place and time to meet. (Remember to make your meeting time 20 30 minutes earlier than departure time to allow filling out Trip Register and group chat about the trip.
 - f. Invite all members.
 - g. Click Create Event.
 - **h.** Member's will reply with name and car number e.g.: Trev & Wassana Car #1,
 - i. Next car will indicate Name & Name Car #2 and so on.
 - **j.** Once the trip is full members will reply Reserve Name & Name Car #1 the reserve car will then slot in if there is a cancellation.

Its recommended to limit the number of Cars to 10, if it becomes popular you can find another trip leader to run two groups.

On the Day

Items for the pre-trip discussion.

- Introduction of Trip leader, Tail End Charlie, and general introduction of members on the day
- Allocate a member to run the trip report (usually whoever arrives late or first to get a "fine")
- Convoy Procedures.
- It's generally worth putting experienced members between inexperienced members and introduce new members.
- On departure get each car to do a radio check (UHF channel 27), nothing worse than losing someone because they can't hear instructions or direction.

After the trip

- Follow up your trip with a fun post on the Members Facebook page.
- Create a photo album on the Members page for the event and encourage members from the trip to share pictures.
- Submit trip report to the Trip Co-Ordinator.

Convoy Procedure

- 1. Each convoy will contain a Trip Leader who will lead the convoy and coordinate the trips activities for the group. The Trip Leader is to brief the convoy members at the commencement of the trip on the day's events.
- 2. The Trip Leader will remind all drivers of the Convoy Procedures before the trips moves off.
- **3.** The Trip Leader will ensure that the trip is self-sufficient and has the necessary recovery gear and other items required to suit.
- **4.** Convoy members should identify themselves to the drivers of the vehicles directly in front and behind them when the convoy is established.
- 5. The Trip Leader will advise the convoy whenever they are to enter a new track or road.
- **6.** It is the responsibility of all drivers to maintain visual contact with the following vehicle, especially at intersections by waiting at each turn until the following vehicle acknowledges the turn by flashing head lights or by UHF radio.
- 7. Each convoy shall contain a nominated Tail End Charlie.
- 8. The Tail End Charlie will advise the Trip Leader whenever they enter a new track or road.
- 9. When there is a breakdown, Tail End Charlie will wait and organise assistance.
- **10.** Drivers must leave a safe distance between vehicles, particularly in hilly country, if brakes are wet after a water crossing or after negotiating difficult terrain.
- 11. When travelling along busy thoroughfares, leave sufficient room for other vehicles to overtake safely.
- **12.** In hazardous areas it is the responsibility of the following driver to ensure the previous vehicle has passed through the hazard before proceeding.
- 13. In the interest of conservation, convoy members are to remain on gazetted or marked tracks.
- 14. Persons leaving the convoy must notify the Trip Leader and, if possible, give details of their intentions.
- **15.** On trips with two or more vehicles, each vehicle will remain in a designated position in the convoy and not overtake the vehicle in front, unless the driver of that vehicle slows down and signals the overtaking vehicle to pass.
- **16.** When any form of recovery is in progress, all those not directly involved in the rescue operations must keep well clear and at a safe distance. Parents are particularly asked to keep their children at a safe distance.
- 17. The consumption of alcohol on club trips should be confined to the lunch break, and then only in moderation. Consumption of alcohol whilst driving should be avoided.
- 18. The use of radio transmitters does not replace convoy procedure.


