



Mount Dissapointment Overnight Trip

Panel damage, wheel lifts, bog holes that'll swallow your car whole, and hills that'll leave you with shaking.

Some trips appeal to everyone. This was not one of those trips.

We were itching to get out on the tracks. We'd planned a nice medium difficulty trip with an overnight stay in Mount Disappointment.

Two of us decided to head out a night early. Andersons Garden campground was a peaceful resting point, with a few small groups scattered around and peace and quiet in abundance. Swags, campfire cooking and cold beers were the main order of business.

Meeting in Wandong the next morning, our group of five became three with a few last-minute absences. This proved pivotal, as we ended up with myself in the LN106 Hilux, Marc in the most adventurous Prado you've ever seen, and Ryan in what is likely the most capable vehicle in the club a twin locked 80 series with reduction gears and all the trimmings.

We made our way along some medium grade tracks, with steep inclines and a few rutted sections. Good for a casual day out.

- Dry Creek Road
- Dry Creek Fire Break
- An unnamed road leading off from Dry Creek Fire Break

Then the real challenge began.

If you're not familiar with Mount Disappointment, The Bump is one of those tracks that defines the area.

It starts out with a *deep* bog hole. At wetter times of year you might expect to be full submerged. This time mud only splashed up through the window.

This is followed by a succession of long bog holes that are unexpectedly deep and soft. Taking a run up won't help you as Ryan found out. The track meanders it's way up the hill, with a number of obstacles including narrow sections with steep drop offs and fallen trees. These serve as a warning to the unwary for what is about to come.

The highlight of the track is a long, off camber section with loose rocks and a bank that's just waiting to remodel your panels. Here lockers will only help you so far. Each of us got caught halfway up the track, either diffed out, or just not able to get traction. After some track building, we each managed to clear this section with relative ease.

Soon after, we faced a 1 meter high, crossed over rock step on a steep section of the track. The 80 series and the Prado cleared this with some careful wheel placement and good spotting. The Hilux however, having got stuck earlier, decided to charge up the track at full speed, hitting the rock step with little thought and stopping only to appreciate the view of the sky above.



After a quick winch we made our way to the next major obstacle of the day, taking the scenic route down Nylander Spur Track. This is comparatively easy going in the dry and a nice way to lul you into a false sense of security. Arriving at our destination, it rose before us. You may know Triton hill by reputation, or you may have seen videos. Whatever you have in mind, take that and double it... then double it again.

It was at this point I realised I'd left my cojones at home and left the serious work to Ryan and Marc.



Going from steep to steeper, the crux of the challenge is another crossed over rock step. The 80 series got to the rock step and spent a good 5 seconds trying to find it's footing but comfortably made it to the top. Next up the Prado took a little longer to get there, but with some excellent spotting from Ryan and a few beads of sweat from Marc, it got to the top safe.

Now that I'd chickened out, the rest of the group had to come back down. Usually you'd expect this to be the easy part, but Ryan took the bonus line, making it perhaps the most terrifying decent I've ever watched. A sentiment shared by his passenger.

This would have been the last major obstacle of the day had we not found another bonus line halfway up Quarry Road. Ryan once again took the hardest route possible, with Marc unwittingly following behind. We thought this a bold move at the time and were proven correct when the Prado found itself millimetres away from rolling on its side.



After getting ourselves together, it seemed like a good time to make our way to the Flowerdale Hotel where we found time to reflect over a pint and a Parma.

For the second night we found a spot to camp and sat around the fire making plans, our group of three cars now back to two.

As the sun rose and the smell of bacon filled the air, we packed up our little camp. Heading to Tallarook we got to enjoy some spectacular views.

Getting into the forest we found some of the steepest terrain I've encountered, interspersed with the occasional bog hole or technical rocky section. For the most part the tracks were medium difficulty and easy day for capable 4WDs.

- Stoney Creek Track
- Jenkin No2 Track
- Tehans No5 Track
- Tehans No4 Track
- Rocky Track
- Cable Track

We planned to attempt Red Hill Track but found it closed, along with a number of others. Much of the forest appears to have sections of fallen trees and we were ill equipped to clear them.

As we ended the day we fell for the old "one last track". Here again we made it halfway down only to find a huge tree lying across the track and the route around unrealistic for the time of day and the amount of winching that would inevitably have followed.

We made our way out, aired up and reflected on what had been a great trip out.

The whole area is worth exploring more and two days isn't enough to do it all. We'll definitely be out again, and next time hopefully I'll have the lockers (and the cajones) to make it up Triton Hill.

Alan Kendall





How to run a Club Trip

It's easy to run your own trip, here are the steps to running a great club trip.

- Contact the Trip Co-Ordinator tripcoordinator@werribee4wdclub.com.au
- The Trip Co-Ordinator will forward on required Trip register etc via email Print out prior to the trip
- Create an Event on Facebook
 - a. Go to Facebook Member's page
 - **b.** Click Events,
 - **c.** Click + in top right-hand side,
 - d. In person Then add date & times,
 - **e.** Location could be the meeting place, Add description, This should be amount of spots available, Required recovery gear, Required training level or Easy, Medium, hard. Meeting place and time to meet. (Remember to make your meeting time 20 30 minutes earlier than departure time to allow filling out Trip Register and group chat about the trip.
 - **f.** Invite all members.
 - g. Click Create Event.
 - h. Member's will reply with name and car number e.g.: Trev & Wassana Car #1,
 - i. Next car will indicate Name & Name Car #2 and so on.
 - **j.** Once the trip is full members will reply Reserve Name & Name Car #1 the reserve car will then slot in if there is a cancellation.

Its recommended to limit the number of Cars to 10, if it becomes popular you can find another trip leader to run two groups.


On the Day

Items for the pre-trip discussion.

- Introduction of Trip leader, Tail End Charlie, and general introduction of members on the day
- Allocate a member to run the trip report (usually whoever arrives late or first to get a "fine")
- Convoy Procedures.
- It's generally worth putting experienced members between inexperienced members and introduce new members.
- On departure get each car to do a radio check (UHF channel 27), nothing worse than losing someone because they can't hear instructions or direction.

After the trip

- Follow up your trip with a fun post on the Members Facebook page.
- Create a photo album on the Members page for the event and encourage members from the trip to share pictures.
- Submit trip report to the Trip Co-Ordinator.



How do I get the Sat Phone?

The Satphone is kept at Dirt Road 4x4 with Trevor Ryan. It can be picked up during business hours by visiting the store. Dirt Road 4x4 is located at Unit 8/61-65 Russell St, Werribee.

Bookings are essential, so please call Trevor to book the phone for your trip on 1300 037 222.
