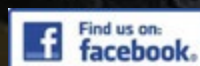

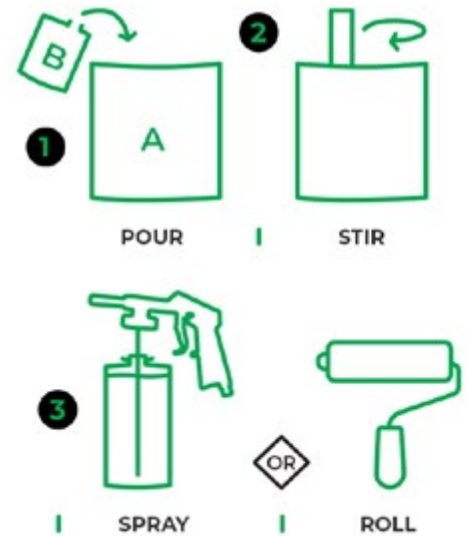

Mundi Mundi Bash 2022

After leaving Eldee Station, Michael and I headed towards the entry gate to the Inaugural Mundi Mundi Bash, located approximately halfway between Silverton and Eldee station.

The Broken Hill Mundi Mundi Bash is Australia's newest outback music festival, which is based on the successful three day music festival called Big Red Bash, which is held every year in July at Birdsville, QLD.

The Inaugural Mundi Mundi Bash was supposed to be held in August 2021, but due to COVID, was postponed twice and was eventually held on April 21-23 2022. It was set on the stunning red dirt of the Mundi Mundi Plains with the beautiful Barrier Ranges as a backdrop. There was plenty of opportunity to take photos of the surrounding signs, upon entry, at the concert area or overlooking the plains for the spectacular sunset.



Now, coming off a gorgeous unseasonably warm 31 degree, dry Easter weekend, we were surprised to learn that it was supposed to rain on Easter Monday. What's a bit of rain and water? It was only forecast for 10ml. By Monday night, it was upgraded to 25ml. By the time it finished raining by midday on Tuesday there had been 45 ml of water. Now that doesn't sound much to us city folk, but in the outback, that results in a dry creek bed filling fast with swift running water at least a meter deep. Let's just say that it put a bit of a kink into vehicles being allowed to roll in to the camp site. Music Festivals can be a bit of an expensive affair – well worth it, but expensive nonetheless. To counter that expense, Michael and I volunteered to work at the event in exchange for our ticket, our campsite, early entry, program material, post event function and a feeling of camaraderie that we haven't experienced before. 8000 – 10,000 people in a well organised, makeshift campsite was amazing.

There were extra activities in the mornings before the concert started including the “Mundi Undie Run”, a world attempt at the “Nut Bush Dance” and a world attempt at the most people gathered in “Mad Max Costumes”. Participating in 2 out of 3 ain’t bad! There was other extra activities including Morning Yoga, Dunny Door Painting, Rock stacking, Camel Rides, Helicopter Flights and between act crowd participation activities.

Even though the music is aimed at those of us who thoroughly enjoyed the 80’s, it definitely wasn’t a country music festival. Those of us who live in near Werribee, have probably seen half the acts at our local “One Electric Day” Concert. But if you haven’t then you better get with the program. There was such a wide variety of ages present, and every one of them had a great time in the “mosh pit”. There is at least a couple of acts who have gained an extra 8000 fans including Furnace and the Fundamentals, and Steve Balbi for his outstanding David Bowie set. Those who attended, was as varied as you can get. There was single people, single vehicles and

groups of 2 or 3 vehicles, as well as big groups of 8, 10 and even a group of 12 vehicles. They arrived on bikes, sports cars, 4wd’s and even a bus or two. Sleeping arrangements were just as varied, swag, tent, or the back of a Ute, trailer, Caravan and apparently even a bus with a converted balcony. Lots of these groups also made an effort to be co-ordinated in their attire, which certainly added to the enthusiasm and opportunity to start a conversation. In the concert area, there was lots of room, lots of food, drinks, singing and dancing. Back at camp, there was still lots of campfires with neighbours, who started off as strangers and left as friends who hope to catch up next time.

We had such a blast, we are going again for the 2022 Mundi Mundi Bash – why don’t you come along as well.

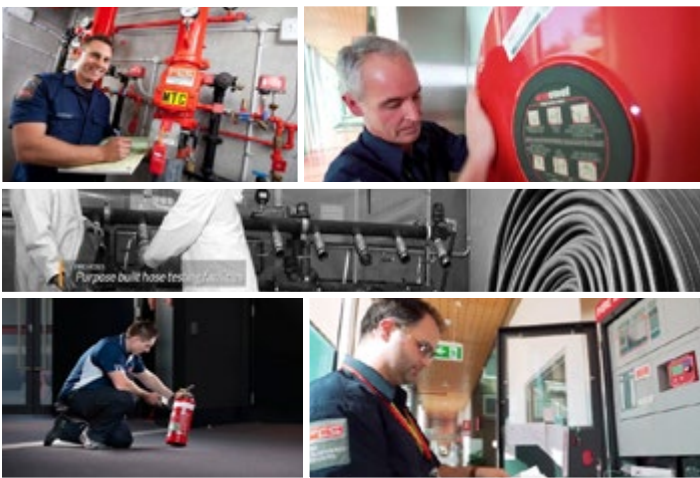

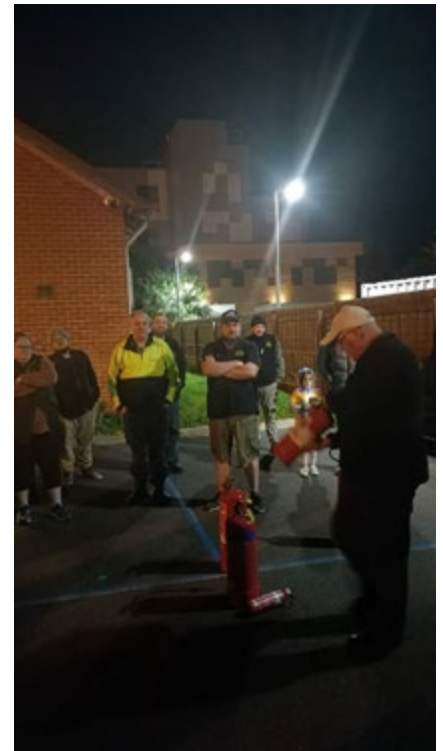

We are so close to 200 donations so it would be great to see a big push in this final month to help get us over the line!!

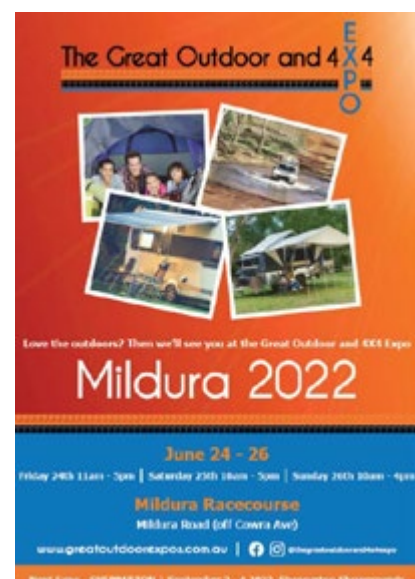

How to run a Club Trip

It's easy to run your own trip, here are the steps to running a great club trip.

- Contact the Trip Co-Ordinator tripcoordinator@werribee4wdclub.com.au
- The Trip Co-Ordinator will forward on required Trip register etc via email – Print out prior to the trip
- Create an Event on Facebook
 - a. Go to Facebook Member's page
 - b. Click Events,
 - c. Click + in top right-hand side,
 - d. In person – Then add date & times,
 - e. Location could be the meeting place, Add description, This should be amount of spots available, Required recovery gear, Required training level or Easy, Medium, hard. Meeting place and time to meet. (Remember to make your meeting time 20 – 30 minutes earlier than departure time to allow filling out Trip Register and group chat about the trip.
 - f. Invite all members.
 - g. Click Create Event.
 - h. Member's will reply with name and car number e.g.: Trev & Wassana Car #1,
 - i. Next car will indicate Name & Name Car #2 and so on.
 - j. Once the trip is full members will reply Reserve Name & Name Car #1 – the reserve car will then slot in if there is a cancellation.

Its recommended to limit the number of Cars to 10, if it becomes popular you can find another trip leader to run two groups.

On the Day

Items for the pre-trip discussion.

- Introduction of Trip leader, Tail End Charlie, and general introduction of members on the day
- Allocate a member to run the trip report (usually whoever arrives late or first to get a "fine")
- Convoy Procedures.
- It's generally worth putting experienced members between inexperienced members and introduce new members.
- On departure get each car to do a radio check (UHF channel 27), nothing worse than losing someone because they can't hear instructions or direction.

After the trip

How do I get the Sat Phone?

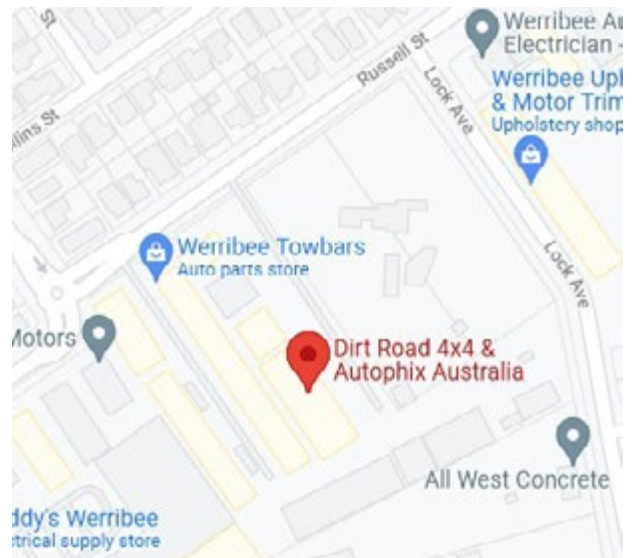
