





Alan Kendall





How to run a Club Trip

It's easy to run your own trip, here are the steps to running a great club trip.

- Contact the Trip Co-Ordinator tripcoordinator@werribee4wdclub.com.au
- The Trip Co-Ordinator will forward on required Trip register etc via email Print out prior to the trip
- Create an Event on Facebook
 - a. Go to Facebook Member's page
 - **b.** Click Events,
 - **c.** Click + in top right-hand side,
 - d. In person Then add date & times,
 - **e.** Location could be the meeting place, Add description, This should be amount of spots available, Required recovery gear, Required training level or Easy, Medium, hard. Meeting place and time to meet. (Remember to make your meeting time 20 30 minutes earlier than departure time to allow filling out Trip Register and group chat about the trip.
 - **f.** Invite all members.
 - g. Click Create Event.
 - h. Member's will reply with name and car number e.g.: Trev & Wassana Car #1,
 - i. Next car will indicate Name & Name Car #2 and so on.
 - **j.** Once the trip is full members will reply Reserve Name & Name Car #1 the reserve car will then slot in if there is a cancellation.

Its recommended to limit the number of Cars to 10, if it becomes popular you can find another trip leader to run two groups.


On the Day

Items for the pre-trip discussion.

- Introduction of Trip leader, Tail End Charlie, and general introduction of members on the day
- Allocate a member to run the trip report (usually whoever arrives late or first to get a "fine")
- Convoy Procedures.
- It's generally worth putting experienced members between inexperienced members and introduce new members.
- On departure get each car to do a radio check (UHF channel 27), nothing worse than losing someone because they can't hear instructions or direction.

After the trip

- Follow up your trip with a fun post on the Members Facebook page.
- Create a photo album on the Members page for the event and encourage members from the trip to share pictures.
- Submit trip report to the Trip Co-Ordinator.



How do I get the Sat Phone?



Mt Disappointment - Sunday 25th Sept.

We set out to challenge ourselves, and that's just what we did.

Wandong IGA provided the perfect jumping off point for our adventure in the woods, taking us directly to some of the best tracks in the forest. Our group included a mix of vehicles including an old Hilux and Patrol (both solid front axle), several Prado's, and three IFS dual cab utes.

We entered on Main Mountain Road. After some initial navigation issues, we found ourselves passing Andersons Garden Campground, a beautiful but busy spot. We made our way up boundy road: a steep track, but in good condition making easy driving. Reaching the top we switched onto Harry's Nose West which is a tight winding track with steep drops on one side and spectacular views. Again this was no challenge but a nice drive.

Towards the top we turned onto Harry's Link Road for a minor obstacle including ruts and a small bog hole followed by a climb, though these was still easy going.

From here we made our way towards Quarry Road, one of the more interesting sections of Mt Disappointment and where we ultimately spent most of our time.



Quarry Road provides numerous options for level of difficult. Our first major challenge of the day was navigating some deep ruts on a slope. The first two cars through enjoyed the benefit of a solid front axle and picked harder lines crossing over the ruts. The Prado's also proved themselves capable vehicles, though selecting smarter lines through. The IFS utes made it look harder, lifting wheels and having to take a more controlled approach. But their drivers took it in their in their stride.

Next up was a winding road along the top of the ridge facing a couple of bog holes and narrow winding track.

Here you can find both scenic lookouts for a picnic, and multiple options for some terrifying descents over steep rock steps and big rocks. We opted for the easier options, which still required careful navigation over some rock steps, as well as crossing over the ruts with careful wheel placement to avoid the drop just millimetres away.



The terrain grew more rutted as we progressed to the bottom of the hill. The Hilux running 33's and having no business to do so ripped of a mud flap whilst flexing through the ruts. Not quite a sick giraffe, but perhaps a sick Llama

Reaching the bottom, we were faced with the potential for a hill climb to get out. I worried that getting up a hill with similar terrain in vehicles without lockers might see us getting out of the forest in the dark. Fortunately Nylander Spur Track offered much more sympathetic terrain.

Undulating hills with the occasional bog hole provided a much more relaxing experience, with just enough spice to keep things interesting.

As the late afternoon light casted golden beams through the trees, the track became quite serene. Now we found an old steam engine, as well as some cars that perhaps shouldn't have gone so deep into the woods. The climax of Nylander Spur Track is descent into a creek followed by a sharp turn up a steep incline. Whilst this presented little difficulty, it was like stepping into a fairly tail: the sound of birds echoing round the forest and the babbling brook under foot.

Reaching the top of the track our group divided. Those who pressed on made their way to Sailor Jack Track. With views across the whole valley, this is a spectacular location. But the view does little to comfort you as you plunge down a steep descent. This is the perfect track for drivers new to steep terrain. It scares the pants off you but is relatively easy. We enjoyed it so much we did it twice.



To end our day, three stragglers journeyed on to the Flowerdale pub.

The epitome of a country pub, when we arrived there was a live band playing and cold beer flowing. Well worth another visit to spend a few more hours enjoying the atmosphere.



This marked the end of our trip. Not only did we have a great experience, but also managed to pick about 4 big bags of rubbish from along the tracks. It's crazy what people throw out in the bush.

It was a beautiful day out, with some nice steep tracks and deep ruts, all in mostly stock 4WDs. We probably only covered 25% of what was planned. I can't wait for the next trip out and more explorations of the forest.
